Artesian Water Supply of lowa Ever since the formation of that nortion of the American continent which now comprises the states of Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa, Illinois and Missouri, the present conditions relative to artesian waters in Iowa have existed.

Over large areas in southern Minnesota and Wisconsin are spread out upon the surface like a gigantic sponge, the outcropping portions of the St. Peter and St. Croix sandstones. A considerable portion of the rainfall over 14.500 square miles of these exposures has for centuries, and ages of centuries, percolated into these layers of sandstone, completely saturating them throughout their entire extent and thus forming an immense reservoir of the purest of waters. This great absorbing area becomes the fountain head for the artesian waters of the states lying toward the

Dipping deeper and deeper beneath the surface as these sandstones spread out under Iowa, Illinois and Missouri, they are reached by the drill at depths varying from a few hundred feet to three thousand feet and more, and usually give satisfactory flows of water wherever reached.
