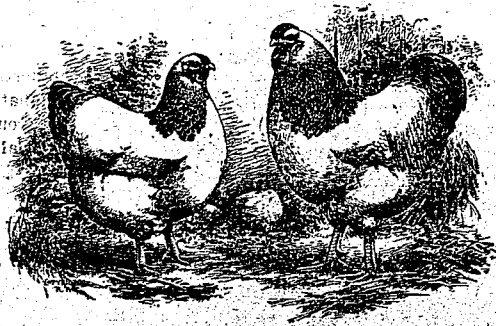

The board of supervisors on motion approved the bond of Frank Wengler for assessor at Remsen, Ia., no recording fees paid. On motion the board approved the report of Geo. M. Smith, county auditor, of the amount of fees received for the months of Jan., Feb., and March, 1914, \$80.75, and allows the expense account of the office for the same months, \$39.53. The report of G. A. Toppings, clerk of courts, of fees collected for Jan., Feb., March, \$507.97, and of fines, \$125.00, was on motion approved. Thereupon the board on motion allowed their bills for committee work, as follows: Peter Arens, committee on bridge, \$46.90; poor, \$3.10; poor farm, \$5.60; total, \$55.60. Wm. H. Deegan, committee on bridge, \$41.75; road, \$14.65; total \$56.40. Chris Fissel, committee on poor, \$45.86; bridge, \$26.50; total, \$72.36. A. A. Lyle, committee on road, \$7.90; bridge, \$34.25; poor \$12.00; total, \$54.15. Geo. Rembe, committee on bridge, \$32.85; road, \$5.00; poor, \$20.30; total, \$58.15. On motion the auditor was authorized to issue warrants on the different funds in payment of the bills and claims allowed at this April session. The board on motion adjourned to meet at 2 p. m. Afternoon session. The board met pursuant to adjournment, all members were present. The board took up the time in the afternoon session in selecting graders and other machinery, and tools to be used during 1914, in the improvement of the roads in Plymouth county. On motion the board enters into contract with the Western Bridge and Construction Company, of Omaha, Neb., as party of the first part. Party of the first part agrees to furnish all labor and such material therefore, to build such wooden bridges and do such repair work, as may be ordered by the second party; the cost of which shall not exceed \$1,000 for any one job, according to plans and specifications made by the second party. This contract now being approved and on file and kept in the auditor's office. On motion the board adjourned to meet at 10 o'clock a. m., Thursday, April 23, 1914. GEO. M. SMITH, County Auditor.
